Barely 15 kilometres long, the Broome Peninsula stretches out into the Indian Ocean like a tropical frontier at the edge of Australia.

To the west lies the Indian Ocean and the 22-kilometre stretch of world-renowned Cable Beach with countless more untouched stretches of coastline extending north and south.

To the east, the protected waters of the Roebuck Bay Marine Park cradle the revitalised Town Beach foreshore, while both sides of the peninsula eventually meet at the iconic Entrance Point.

Positioned within Australia's tropical zone, between the Tropic of Capricorn and the equator, Broome enjoys warm weather year-round, with average temperatures ranging from 21°C overnight to 32°C during the day.

Traditionally, the tropics are defined by two distinct seasons - the dry season from April to November and the tropical wet season from December to March. But for the local Yawuru people, six seasons are recognised instead - defined not by calendar dates, but by the subtle environmental changes in flora, fauna, tides and winds.

Gazetted in 1883, Broome began as a rough pearling settlement of sandhill camps and humble shacks servicing pearlshells and their crews.

Drawn here by the booming pearling industry, people from dozens of nations made Broome their home, creating the rich multicultural character, relaxed lifestyle and tropical atmosphere that still define the town today.

Broome is globally recognised as the home of the world's finest cultured pearls - grown right here in our pristine Kimberley waters.

While in Broome, you are truly spoilt for choice.

Explore the town's highlights on a guided tour or venture deeper into the Kimberley on a full-day or extended safari through the Dampier Peninsula and remote West Kimberley.

Choose from world-class reef, creek and game fishing charters, eco cruises, sunset sails, whale watching, cultural and Indigenous experiences or perhaps the most iconic experience of all - a pearl farm tour. Nature also delivers Broome's daily free spectacles. Sublime sunsets over Cable Beach and Gantheaume Point. Pastel sunrises over Roebuck Bay. The captivating Staircase to the Moon. Crystal-clear starlit skies. And our warm pristine and coastline. Broome's art galleries, public art installations, library, parks and playgrounds are all free to enjoy. The Broome Historical Museum is also recommended for those wishing to dive deeper into the town's remarkable pearling and multicultural history.

Broome also stands proudly as the gateway to the unspoilt Dampier Peninsula; the epic gorges and four-wheel-drive adventures of the

Gibb River Road and the majestic Kimberley coastline scattered with the thousand-plus islands of the Buccaneer Archipelago - one of the world's last great untouched wilderness regions.

Daily scenic flights depart Broome for breathtaking Kimberley destinations, including the internationally renowned Mitchell and Horizontal Falls and the spectacular 1000 islands of the Buccaneer Archipelago.

SUNSET TIMES IN BROOME

One of Broome's greatest daily rituals is sunset. From the blazing orange skies of Cable Beach to the rugged coastline of Gantheaume Point, visitors and locals alike gather each evening to watch the sun disappear into the Indian Ocean and light up the Kimberley Coastline. Sunset times vary only slightly throughout the second half of the year, making it easy to time sunset dinners, camel rides, beach walks or simply a quiet drink overlooking the water.

DON'T MISS OUR ICONIC COURTHOUSE MARKETS

Broome's markets are as colourful and eclectic as the town itself, offering everything from local art and handmade jewellery to tropical fashion, fresh produce and delicious food. The iconic Broome Courthouse Markets are held within the shady heritage gardens of the historic Broome Courthouse on the edge of Chinatown. Markets operate every Saturday year-round and Sundays during the dry season, creating a lively community atmosphere loved by locals and visitors alike.

8am – 1pm Saturdays / Seasonal Sundays

At Town Beach, the popular Staircase to the Moon Night Markets coincide with the natural phenomenon of the Staircase to the Moon, combining market stalls, food vendors, live entertainment and moonrise views over Roebuck Bay.

4pm – 8pm on selected full moon dates

Also held at Town Beach are the relaxed Thursday Night Markets, featuring local stalls, live music and tropical dining under the stars.

CHINATOWN

You can view the world's largest fine-quality round pearl - the 22.24mm Australian South Sea pearl - at Cygnet Bay Pearls Chinatown Showroom on Dampier Terrace in Chinatown, just a short stroll from the historic Streeter's Jetty. Continue to the top of the street and climb the Roebuck Bay Lookout for uninterrupted 180-degree views across Roebuck Bay, Dampier Creek and the shoreline once home to more than 400 pearl luggers. Wander into and through the rows of deck chairs at Sun Pictures - the world's oldest operating picture gardens, established in 1903 and still showing movies nightly beneath the stars. But be warned when crossing the road in Chinatown - in Broome, traffic still gets right of way over foot traffic.

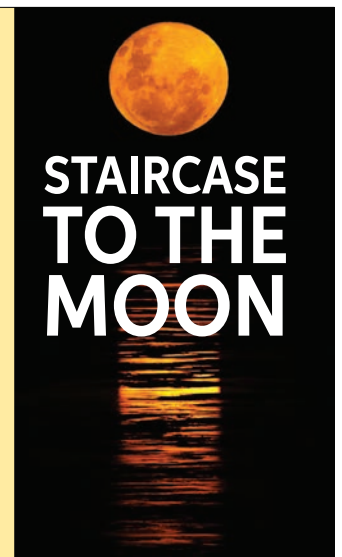

TWIN FLAMES – IS THIS THE KIMBERLEY NEXT ICON?

The Kimberley sometimes seems almost too ancient to be real, and some places deep within the Kimberley defy accurate description. Hidden deep within the rugged Wunaamin Miliwundi Ranges lies Twin Flames, a spectacular 90+ metre waterfall that very few people will ever see. There are no roads, no walking trails and no lookout platforms. The only way to experience this remarkable natural wonder is by helicopter from Mount Hart Wilderness Lodge.

The adventure begins as your helicopter lifts off from Mount Hart and climbs above one of Australia's last unspoiled wilderness areas. Within minutes, the vast Kimberley landscape magically unfolds beneath you.

Ancient sandstone ranges, winding river systems, hidden gorges and endless untamed wilderness stretches as far as the eye can see.

As you fly through Gateway Gorge, across the Isdell River Valley and past remote waterfalls that few people have ever witnessed, you quickly realise why helicopters have become

one of the most sought-after ways to experience the Kimberley. The scale of the country is simply impossible to appreciate from the ground.

Then, suddenly out of nowhere, Twin Flames appears.

Two towering waterfalls that cascade, plunging from the escarpment into a secluded gorge below. Surrounded by red cliffs, ancient rock formations and pristine wilderness, the falls create a scene that feels untouched by time.

From the air, the view is absolutely breathtaking. But you don't see it all at first. As you approach, seemingly immersed into the barren wilderness with birds eye view, you pause - then start to slowly rotate until the full wonder of Twin Flames is fully revealed.

The helicopter then circles the falls, providing you panoramic views of the cascading water and the rugged Kimberley landscape beyond. You can add a landing near the falls for an even closer encounter with this remote hidden wonder.

What makes Twin Flames truly special is its exclusivity. Unlike many natural attractions, there are literally no crowds - no other person in sight.

The Kimberley is well known for iconic destinations such as Horizontal Falls, Mitchell Falls and Bell Gorge, but Twin Flames offers something very different - the feeling of discovering a place that remains largely hidden from the world.

For travellers seeking a once-in-a-lifetime Kimberley experience, Twin Flames has quickly become the region's newest must-see attraction. As your helicopter banks away from the falls and heads back across the endless wilderness towards Mount Hart, or to your exclusive drop off point, you'll understand why those few fortunate to experience describe Twin Flames experience as the pinnacle of their Kimberley adventure.

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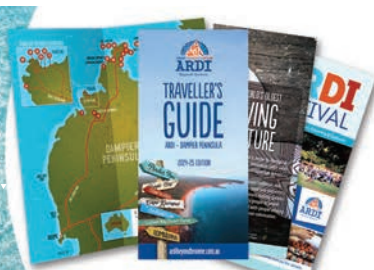

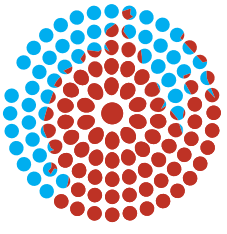

BROOME'S BEST KEPT SECRET: Exploring Dampier Peninsula's Cape Leveque Road

For those with a sense of adventure and an appreciation for unspoiled natural beauty, the Cape Leveque Road offers a journey into the heart of Western Australia's rugged Dampier Peninsula. Once a challenging off-road route, this 205-kilometre road is now fully sealed, providing a smoother and quieter ride to explore this remote region. However, the true allure lies in the pindan dirt tracks that branch off along the way, leading to unspoiled secluded bays, pristine beaches, and cultural communities and treasures.

Preparing for the Adventure

... Before setting off on this epic experience, there are a few essential rules to keep in mind. A 4WD vehicle is highly recommended, as many of the dirt tracks are unsuitable for standard cars. Travel is only permitted on designated roads, and free camping is prohibited, so be sure to book accommodation or campsites in advance. Take photos, leave footprints, and capture memories.

Wildlife and Scenery Along the Road

... The first hour of the drive is an uninterrupted stretch of bitumen, where the vibrant red pindan dirt contrasts strikingly with the native flora. Be vigilant for roaming cattle and donkeys, as well as wildlife like wallabies, dingoes, goannas, and lizards. Bird enthusiasts will delight in spotting brolgas, hawks, osprey, eagles, and another 300+ species of birds. The Cape Leveque Road isn't just a path to your destination – it's a wildlife corridor offering glimpses of Australia's extraordinary biodiversity.

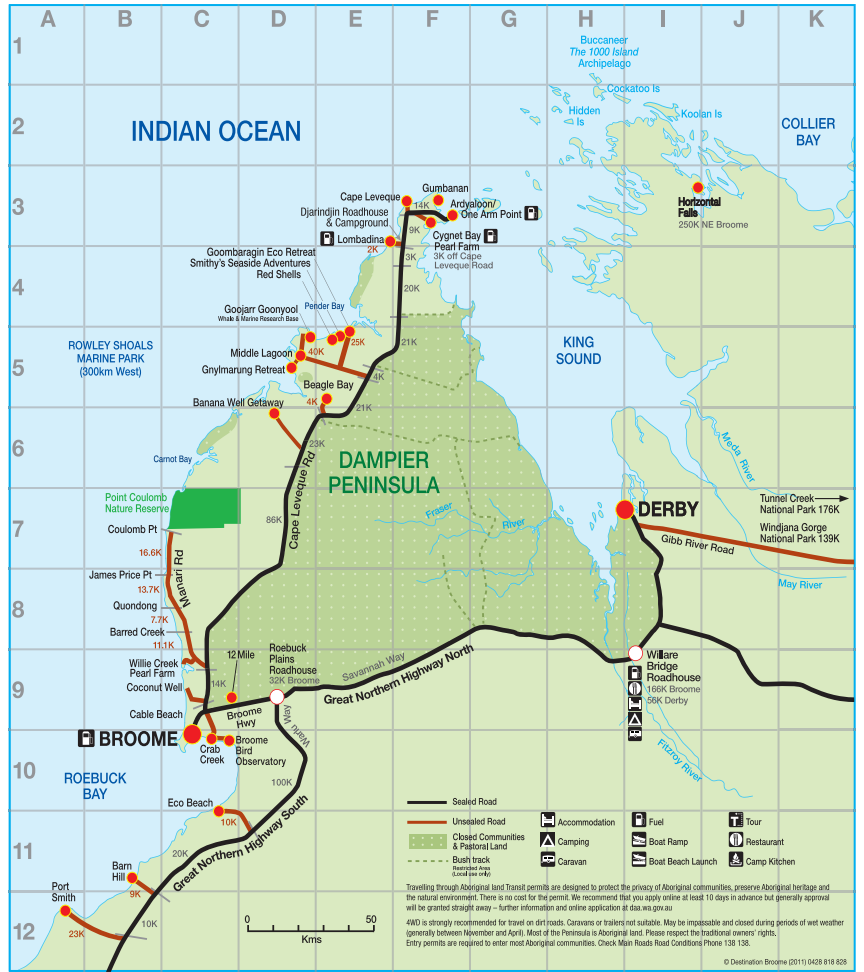
Must-Visit Stops and Day Trip Options

... If you're planning a day trip, you're spoiled for choice. Several destinations along the Cape Leveque Road are open to visitors, including Middle Lagoon, Beagle Bay, Lombadina Campgrounds, Cygnet Bay, and Ardyaloon. Entry fees may apply, and it's essential to register at community offices upon arrival. These offices also provide valuable local information and updates on restrictions.

For those planning an extended stay, the peninsula offers a variety of accommodation options, from eco-retreats to campgrounds. Here's a guide to some of the best spots:

Banana Well Getaway... Located just over halfway up the road, this off-grid ecofriendly bush campground offers shaded, grassed sites and air-conditioned cabins. Perfect for fishing, crabbing, and bushwalking, Banana Well is dog-friendly and open year-round. Cool off in the artesian springwater dip pool before continuing your journey.

Beagle Bay and the Sacred Heart Church... Famous for its mother-of-pearl-encrusted altar, the Sacred Heart Church is a must-see cultural and historical site. Open from March to October, it's a serene stop steeped in heritage. Kimberley Cultural Adventures offers a guided Aboriginal Cultural Tour from Broome to Beagle Bay return.



Pender Bay and the Adventure track... One of the most exciting tracks off Cape Leveque Road is the track to Pender Bay. It takes you through varying terrain from corrugations to soft sand. Deflate your tyres and take it slow.

Middle Lagoon (Nature's Hideaway)... A highlight for campers, Middle Lagoon boasts large camping areas with both powered and unpowered sites overlooking the turquoise waters of White Beach Bay. Day visitors are welcome.

Gnylmarung Retreat... For those seeking peace and solitude of a secluded cove on Beagle Bay, this retreat offers unpowered sites with ocean views complete with a boat ramp and fish cleaning facilities.

Mercedes Cove Exclusive Eco Retreat... A secluded paradise, Mercedes Cove features eco-tents, cabins, and a two-bedroom chalet with uninterrupted ocean views. It's an ideal spot for swimming, snorkelling, and fishing. ...Continued inside

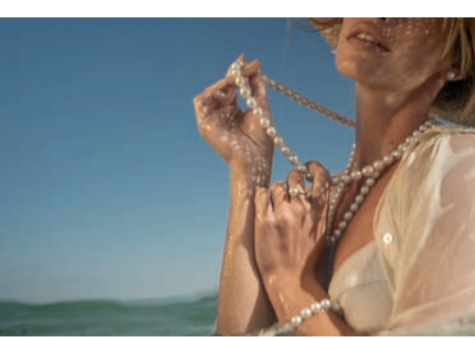

DINOSAUR TRACKS

- 1. Marlagan on Cable Beach rocks**
Between the steps in front of the playground and the steps 200 metres to the North (or to the right when facing Cable Beach)
• Theropods and Sauropods
• Site is frequently covered by sand
• In September 2017 this location hit all the international news when sand exposed tracks that had not been seen for years
- 2. Reddell Beach**
All the way along south to Entrance Point
• Theropods and Sauropods
• Accessible when Kavite Road is open
- 3. Entrance Point**
• Sauropod trackway
• Accessible at all times, except when Port Drive is flooded, to low level vehicles
• Suitable for small children – just near car park. Trike tours visit this location regularly.
- 4. Minyir - Gantheaume Point**
The most dangerous site
• Limited number of Sauropod and Theropod tracks
• High risk – hard to climb down, slippery rocks
- 5. Gingsgala and Guribanwa - Crab Creek**
2 locations
• Great Sauropod tracks and trackways – Well preserved tracks of both the front and back foot
• Guribanwa (near B80 and improved boat ramp) is the best preserved sauropod platform

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
